As you may have guessed, we have a number of events planned for this fall. The first big event will be the fall Bike Rally on September 27th. This will be at Maybury State Park (rain or shine) and is being organized by the Buffalo Nation. This has always been a favorite event for my boys and lunch will be provided.

Next we have the New Member Orientation on September 20th (at 5:00 pm in the Y meeting room) that is being organized by the Medicine Man. This is an opportunity for new members to ask questions and learn more about the Indian Guide Program.

Then the Lance Nation is preparing the fall campout, October 3rd - 5th, at Camp Manitou-Lin in Middleville, Michigan for us. This promises to be a great event complete with ropes courses and horseback riding. Please sign up early to make sure you are bunking with your tribe members.

October 18th is our first Fun Night at the Y. Don't forget your swimming suits and equipment for tennis or racket ball.

Finally, please be sure to read the Assistant Federation Chief's Report to find out about this year's Fundraiser. We have lowered the minimum commitment to \$75 with the hope that everyone will contribute. These funds are used to help offset the costs of Federation Events.

Assistant Federation Chief Report

Hello to all Braves Big and Small! Welcome to this year's YMCA Indian Guides program. Hopefully everyone had a safe and enjoyable summer. The kids and I are really looking forward to being your Assistant Federation Chief. This year's officers are already busy making sure all of the planned events are as successful as they always are!

FUNDRALSER -As a reminder, it is suggested that each family commit to a minimum of a \$75 dollar cash donation or fundraising dollars. The primary fund raising program this year will be Domino's pizza coupons. These are full-color, glossy, tri-fold coupons that say "Domino's Community Fund Raising Coupons" on the The cost of the coupons will be \$15, with 100% going to the guides. (The coupons are clearly printed with the price and "100% of Proceeds Benefit Livonia YMCA Indian Guides Program" on the front). This is a great deal because the coupon book has 25 coupons, one of which is for 1 free large pizza, so customers will get most of their money back with that one coupon. The rest of the coupons are buy 1 get 1 free (large and medium), 1/2 off a pick-up order, free Breadstix with order, and free Cinna Stix with order. (These things sell themselves as I've already sold a number of them!). Special thanks to Domino's pizza for their participation. We will also be doing a bottle/can drive on Saturday November 1. A flyer will be available in advance so that you can distribute to houses a week or so before. More info on the can drive will be in the October issue of Smoke Signals. For those of you more comfortable with selling candy, this will be an optional, "self-order" alternative for anyone that is interested. Remember, all individual fund raising monies acquired through pizza coupons, bottle/can drive, or candy sales will go against your \$75 minimum per family donation. Of course, we are always open to corporate sponsorships, too! Feather award patches will be given based on fundraising amounts (\$75-Hunter, \$105 Great Hunter, \$125-Mighty Hunter). We are also planning prizes again for top fundraising braves. Pizza coupons will be available at all upcoming events, or by contacting me at timbumpus@peoplepc.com or phone 248-473-2595. NOTE: All fundraising monies (pizza coupons, bottle/can drive, candy, donation) are due to me by November 15, 2003.

As most of you already know, this will be the last year that we will be known as the Indian Guides. Next year we will begin our transition to the new Adventure Guides program. We will use future issues of Smoke Signals to update everyone on this new program.

Finally, don't forget all of the upcoming events that are just around the corner...Bike Rally on September 27, Fall Campout at Manitou-Lin on October 3-5 (see registration form in this newsletter), and the Fall Fun Night on October 18. All of the officers would also like to continue to emphasize that no brave should have to miss a campout due to financial reasons. If you need help, let us know.

Hello all Big and Little Braves...



We did re-organize as participation has fallen off over the last several years. The Tomahawk Nation has been retired this year and tribes moved into the remaining Canoe, Buffalo, and Lance Nations. This does put more burden on Nation Chiefs to organize events. Please help them if you are called upon or contact them to volunteer.

New members are welcomed any time during the year. Most of us were recruited by friends, neighbors, co-workers, relatives, or through YMCA events. I challenge every member to talk to others about the program and recruit at least one new member during their tenure.
